1). CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Jon Sanford called meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

2). PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor led City Council and audience into the Pledge of Allegiance.

4). MINUTES

MOTION (Barbour) to approve February 6, 2024 regular meeting minutes as presented; support (Heinrich). Motion carried.

Mayor asked for public comments for DNR Natural Resources Trust Fund Grant Application. This grant application of \$400,000 will go towards the overall cost of the Riverfront Campground Expansion and be used for a new bathhouse and amenities. City will do a percent match towards this grant. No public comments were made.

7). AU GRES CITY POLICE CHIEF REPORT

Police Chief Charles Allen was present tonight and had February 2024 stats included in council packet. Please note that he did start reporting all assists to the County Sheriff Department and also calls the Arenac County Sheriff Department assisted and/or handled in the city limits. He also mentioned that there will be an insert in the next water billing going out end of April on blight enforcement and that City will be getting dumpsters for city residents to use to clean up their yard and/or blight.

9.1 Open Public Hearing/Sale of Property

City Manager informed Council that ATD is offering \$15,000 for 2 lots contiguous to their business with no infrastructure offered and land locked parcels and John Rollins is offering \$15,000 for one lot with infrastructure to build pole building for storage. For now, ATD is willing to let disc golf course remain on these lots (2 holes) with no plans of future expansion; just a back entrance driveway connecting all parcels together. No public comments were made.

10). CITY MANAGER REPORT

- Planning Commission is developing an Agriculture Labor Camp Ordinance and Short-Term Rental
 Ordinance. Becoming a problem in town and City needs to have an ordinance to regulate. Biggest
 issues are parking and occupancy limits. John Popovich: allow short term rentals with control.
 Agricultural labor camp ordinance set up to be on the farm they are working on only; will regulate
 the migrant workers coming up to work in the area. Will have rough draft ordinances of both
 later for City Council review.
- Working with Republic Waste on blight elimination program that Chuck talked about. Hoping to get 2-3 dumpsters for couple weeks to help residents get rid of blight issues in their yards; more information to follow with insert in next water bills.
- Park expansion project moving forward this spring.
- Pavilion repairs are scheduled to start March 2024.
- Post Office is trying to work a deal with the McDonald's investors.
- Chapel repairs- applied for \$10,000 ACF Maser Historical grant to refurbish floors, repair windows and upgrade electrical. Also applied to Consumer Energy "Put Your Town on the Map" grant towards this project as well.
- Fireworks Raffle/Trivia Night is set for April 8 at Ali's.

<u>Burke:</u> Any word on the Lodge hotel/restaurant? City Manager answered that April 1 is expected opening date for hotel and restaurant.
